Finally, Creek Café is back. Unfortunately, we had to put a hold on the program earlier in the year due to Covid restrictions. We are all very excited to have the program back up and running. Students love working with Ms Fenlon on the Creek Café program and we love eating their yummy creations.

We started the Creek Café program in Term 2 last year and it has been a huge success ever since. Grade 5/6 students who participate in the program get the opportunity to cook lunch for each class on a fortnightly rotational basis. The process involves planning a menu, ordering ingredients online, collecting orders, counting money, food preparation, food service and cleaning up. Spaghetti bolognese has been on the menu for the last two weeks and this week and next week, is chicken pasta.

At ACPS we strongly believe in giving students hands-on learning opportunities linked to real life. Through participation in Creek Café (as well as our Kitchen Garden and Creek programs), students develop a broad range of social, life and employability skills, which are linked to all curriculum areas. Students truly love working on these programs and it has been great to see their skills develop in so many areas.

We always ensure our menu items align with our Move Well, Eat Well policy and we use ingredients from our school vegetable garden where possible.

We thank our families and staff for supporting the program each week. More information about what is on the menu each fortnight, copies of the recipes and the timetable is available on Skoolbag.

As I'm writing this newsletter item, I have just had one of our very talented Creek Café chefs deliver my lunch – chicken pasta. It smells delicious, my taste buds are watering, and I can no longer concentrate. Yummo!

COVID-19 UPDATES

Vaccination status no longer required for visitors and staff

As advised by the DoE Secretary last week, the recent review of the [Risk Management Plan](#) concluded that it's no longer practicable or reasonable for staff to provide their vaccination evidence in a workplace health and safety context.

As a result of this review, our *COVID-19 Vaccination Policy* has been rescinded and staff and volunteers are no longer required to provide details of their COVID-19 vaccination status.

I do want to thank everyone who complied with this policy. This was an incredibly important risk mitigation strategy, based on the circumstances at the time, to ensure the safety of our staff and students. The fact we have such a highly vaccinated workforce, and the Tasmanian population in general, helps to limit the impacts of COVID-19 on us and the services we deliver.

We currently have a number of COVID-19 safety measures in place in all Department of Education sites. It's important that we all continue to practise COVID-safe behaviours, such as:

- Staying at home if unwell and [getting tested](#).
- Physical distancing where practical.
- Wearing face masks if you can't physically distance or when working with students vulnerable to COVID-19. (Noting: staff can wear face masks at any time and are strongly supported to do so).

Free flu shots until 31 August

It's not too late to get your flu shot this winter!

Flu may have taken a back seat recently, but it can be serious and it's back. Some people are at greater risk of becoming severely unwell if they get the flu. Flu vaccines are recommended for everyone over six months of age.

Until the end of August, all Tasmanians can get a free flu vaccine at:

- GPs and state-run community clinics for all people aged six months and over.
- Participating pharmacies for all people aged 10 years and over.

Speak with your GP, healthcare provider or local pharmacist to book an appointment. Normal Medicare arrangements apply for GP consultations.

Parent Workshops - Teaching Kids Consent

SASS (Sexual Assault Support Service) is running some workshops in September aimed at parents/guardians and other family members.

The 90 minute online workshop is named "Teaching Kids Consent" and it is an introductory session for adults interested in empowering children and young people with behaviours that enable them to recognise situations in which their personal space and sense of safety may be compromised.

We will discuss ways we can empower children to know what safety might look and feel like, provide them with strong language skills to ask for help if they need it, and to identify the safe people in their life for support and protection.

This workshop is intended for parents and guardians of children, but all are welcome.
