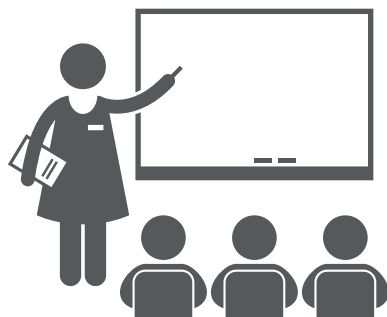

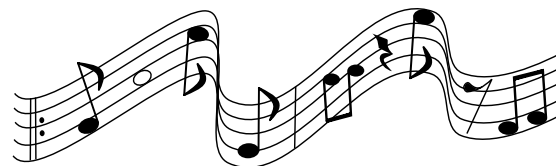

We have received many end of year donations to contribute toward our book prizes for students. We would like to make a special mention to the Port Sorell Lions Club for their VERY generous donation of \$500.

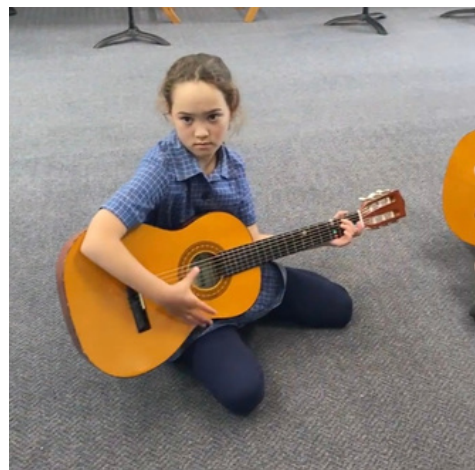
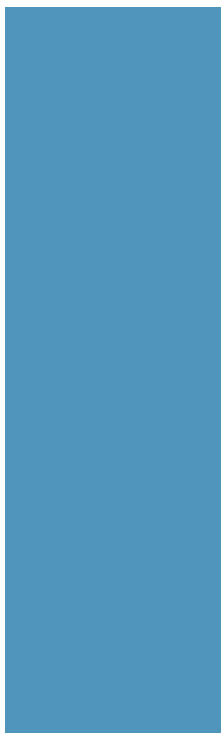


# Music Class

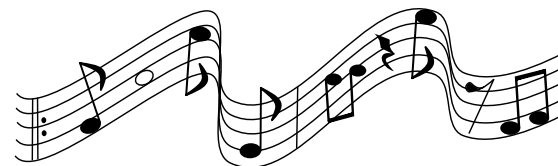


This year in Prep - Grade 2 Music, students have been learning to play tuned and untuned percussion and steel drums. They have composed their own melodies using chime bars and performed them to the class. They have also composed their own percussion music using graphic notation.

This year in Grades 3 - 6 Music, students have learned how to play keyboard, xylophone, marimba, guitar, bass guitar, ukulele and drum kit. Our focus has been on learning to play melodies and chords using guitar tablature and letter notation. They have also learned to play drum kit and read basic drum notation.



# Fabian's Visit



On Wednesday 7 December, Fabian Spratt a former student of Andrews Creek Primary, came to visit our Prep - Grade 2 and Grade 5/6 students. Fabian has just finished Year 12 at the Don College and decided he'd like to come back and share his musical talents with our students. This was a rare musical treat, with our student astonished by his skills on the electric and acoustic guitars and on the tenor horn and trumpet.

Fabian is an exceptional guitarist who has an amazing sound, wonderful technique and who plays soulfully and expressively. The children asked him all sorts of questions, including when he started playing the guitar (aged 10, and more seriously at 15), how he became so good (with lots of practice and hard work) and what was his favourite piece to learn ('Emily'). Fabian also played while we sang 'Believer' which was fun!

The children learned about why we use all the fingers when learning the guitar, how to build strength in your hands and fingers, what a bend is, how the different guitars sound when played in different ways and how an amplifier works. He also talked about and demonstrated some of the pieces that the Grade 5/6's themselves are learning. They also learned that Fabian performs for a living, playing gigs and what it's like to play for people in different settings.

The children also learned about brass instruments, including the tenor horn and trumpet. The children discovered that Fabian learned to play these in the Latrobe Federal Brass Band when he was 8. There was some discussion about how it is easier to play a second instrument, because you have already built skills with the first.

It was wonderful for Fabian's old primary school teachers to see him again. The students especially enjoyed finding Fabian on the wall in a Moriarty Primary School photo. It was an absolute joy to have him come back to play for us. Thank you so much Fabian for coming to share your exceptional talents with our students.

## Christmas Dress Up Day

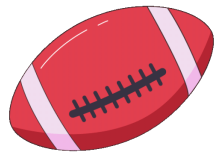

**The colour may stain so please make sure students wear old clothes and shoes. Students who wear school uniform to school will unfortunately not be able to participate.**

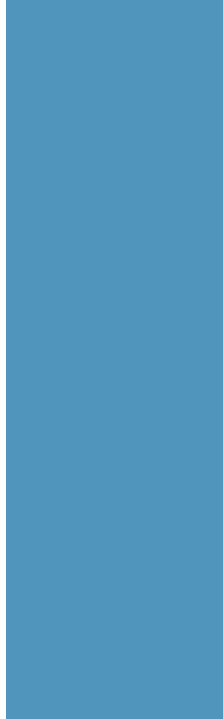
Parents who have offered to help, please come to school by 1.35pm and meet staff on the oval.

**We have raised a huge \$6,621 which will go towards a new GaGa Pit for our playground next year.**



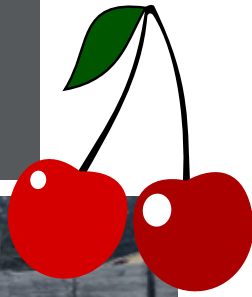

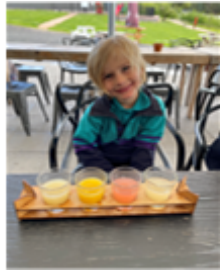
# Class Focus - Kinder
