## Safeguarding Training in our Schools

It will help you understand what to do if you believe a child or young person is or may be being harmed, and to make sure you are doing all you can to prevent this from happening. The training will also tell you what you must report under the new laws.

From here please click on the volunteers and service providers training at the bottom left to create an account to access the training platform. This training will only take 15 minutes and then it will provide you with a certificate, this will be valid until the end of 2024. Please save this as office staff will ask to sight this when you sign in at school.

**A reminder that you will also need a current RWVP card to also volunteer at school.** Please bring this each time as you will need the number to check in to the school sign in kiosk.

Buses arrive at school between 8:40am and 8:50am.

Buses depart school between 3:00pm and 3:05pm.

To ensure the safety of our students, all students using a bus service are marked off a bus list.

Students will be asked each day if they are 'bus' or 'pick up'. If your child is being picked up or needs to change buses, a Seesaw message to the teacher, a note or phone call to the school is essential. We will not take "word of mouth" from students. If the student is unsure of their travel arrangements home, we will use the information provided by you at the beginning of the year on the Student Travel Arrangement form.

**A Bus Code of Behaviour form was sent home with students this week. If you haven't already returned it, please do so by Monday 19 February.**

Additional copies are available from the office. It is our expectation that all students adhere to the Bus Code of Conduct while travelling on the bus.



# Resilience Project

Throughout 2024, we will be working closely with The Resilience Project to support the wellbeing of our school community. The Resilience Project is committed to teaching positive mental health strategies to prevent mental ill-health and build young people's capacity to deal with adversity.

Our Partnership Program consists of online presentations and weekly lessons for students, professional development for staff, and Parent & Carer Hub (inc. digital presentations) for our parent and carer community.

Over the coming weeks, teachers and students will begin to engage in weekly lessons and activities around the key principles of Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness (GEM), and Emotional Literacy to build resilience. We will also be sharing the Parent & Carer Hub with you. The videos are 5-10 minutes long and will walk through the key pillars of resilience: Gratitude, Empathy & Mindfulness. You'll hear stories and be introduced to activities to show how these strategies can support our kids' learning and development, and also support you as parents and carers.

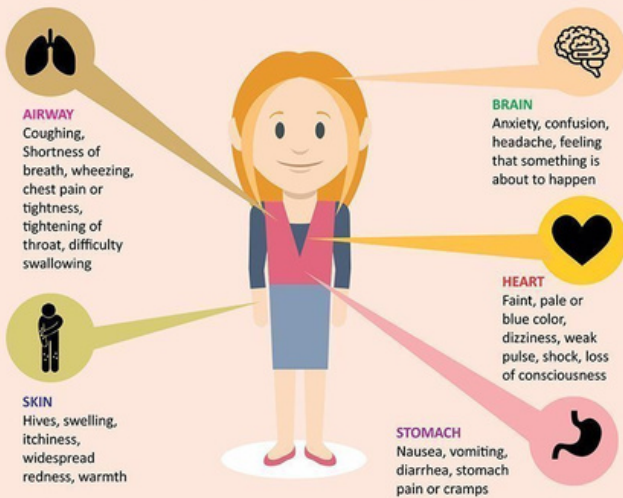
# School Parking & Traffic Rules

A reminder about our parking and traffic rules to keep our students and families safe. We also need to make sure our buses can get safely into the bus gate.

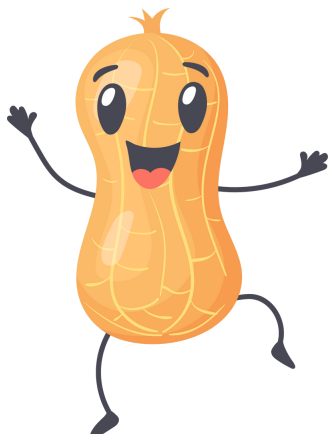
## Anaphylaxis

ACPS is a respectful community of learners and families, and we are mindful that there are students in our school with severe allergies. With no known cure for food allergy, awareness and education are most important, as an allergic reaction can quickly become life threatening.

Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and is potentially life threatening. It must be treated as a medical emergency, requiring immediate treatment and urgent medical attention. Anaphylaxis usually occurs within minutes or up to 2 hours of exposure to the trigger and can rapidly become life threatening.

As a school, we need to ensure that;

- We are not sharing food items
- We wash our hands regularly
- **We are mindful if there is someone in our classroom with severe allergies, we are not aware.**

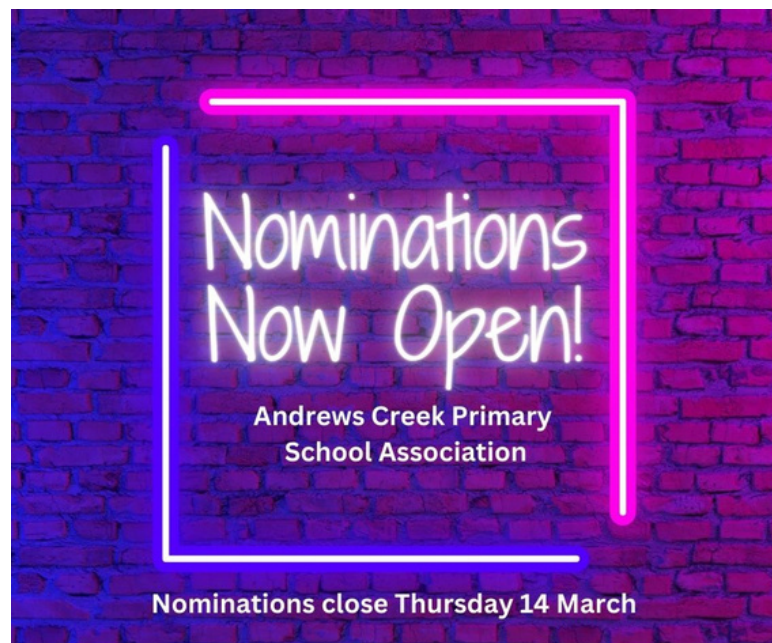

Welcome to the 2024 DBC Inc. Winter Roster Primary School roster.

The Devonport Basketball Council Inc. will continue to run the 2024 Winter Primary School roster as school-based teams for children in grades 1 to 6. For schools that do not have enough players to field a full team the DBC Inc. will combine schools.

**Grades 1 & 2 roster** will commence on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March and run through until 26<sup>th</sup> June (12 weeks). No games will be played during the April school holidays and on the 5<sup>th</sup> June due to possible NWBU finals.

**Grade 3 & 4 and 5 & 6 rosters** will commence on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March and run through until 28<sup>th</sup> June (12 weeks). There will be no games played on Good Friday, April school holidays and 7<sup>th</sup> June due to possible NWBU finals.

It is a requirement of Basketball Tasmania that all players register online through PlayHQ.

## REGISTRATION FEES

Basketball Tasmania has increased their registration fees for the first time in 6 years from \$35.00 to \$45.00 for U10 and U12 age groups and from \$60.00 to \$70.00 for U14 and above.

This increase comes about to cover the increasing demand for BTAs services and support and increased costs across all areas of the BTAs operation.

In addition, Basketball Australia have introduced a Game Development Levy of \$5.61, this is an annual fee. Levy is being implemented by BA to support growth and development of basketball at all levels of the game and to enhance opportunities for the sport.

Registration fees are made up of the following components:

**Basketball Tasmania Fee – 12 months fee of \$45.00 (for U10 and U12 players) and \$70.00 for U14 players.** Compulsory state registration fee also includes insurance in the unlikely event of an injury. Basketball Tasmania fee is automatically calculated on your DOB.

**NWBU Fee – 12 month fee of \$11.00 or 6 months \$5.50** – compulsory fee to play in any competition on the NW Coast.

**Basketball Australia Levy – 12 month fee of \$5.61** – Compulsory levy set by BA.

**DBC Inc Fee \$40.00** – club registration to Devonport Basketball Council Inc. to participate in the winter primary school roster.

For children that qualify for **TICKET TO PLAY** you will register through the link below and click I have a government voucher (in payment/summary page), add your TTP details which will cover registration/door fees except when fees are over \$100 you will be required to cover the difference.

## WEEKLY DOOR FEES

After consulting with numerous players and parents of junior players, the club has taken the decision to include the weekly playing/door fees in the registration process.

Contributing factors included

- Parents inconvenience of finding \$3 cash each week.
- Eliminate cash handling (collecting, counting and banking)
- To reduce the drain on (limited) volunteers; eliminate door keepers.

The upfront playing fee will be \$35.00 based on 12 roster games. This will be in addition to registration fees listed above.

Should this new arrangement cause hardship or stop your child from playing please contact us to make an alternative arrangement, as the last thing we want is to stop anyone from participating. There is no increase in cost just an upfront payment of playing fees.

**PlayHQ now also gives participants the choice to pay fees in instalments using "PayPal Pay in 4 option"**

**Please note the club has not increased registration or door fees for several years now although we have seen increased costs in running the roster and keeping the club operating.**

If placed in a combined school team that will be using Devonport Basketball singlets you will be required to pay a singlet bond of \$10.00 and will receive \$5.00 refund at the end of the season providing the singlet is returned in good condition. This is to be paid when playing your first roster game.

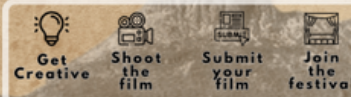

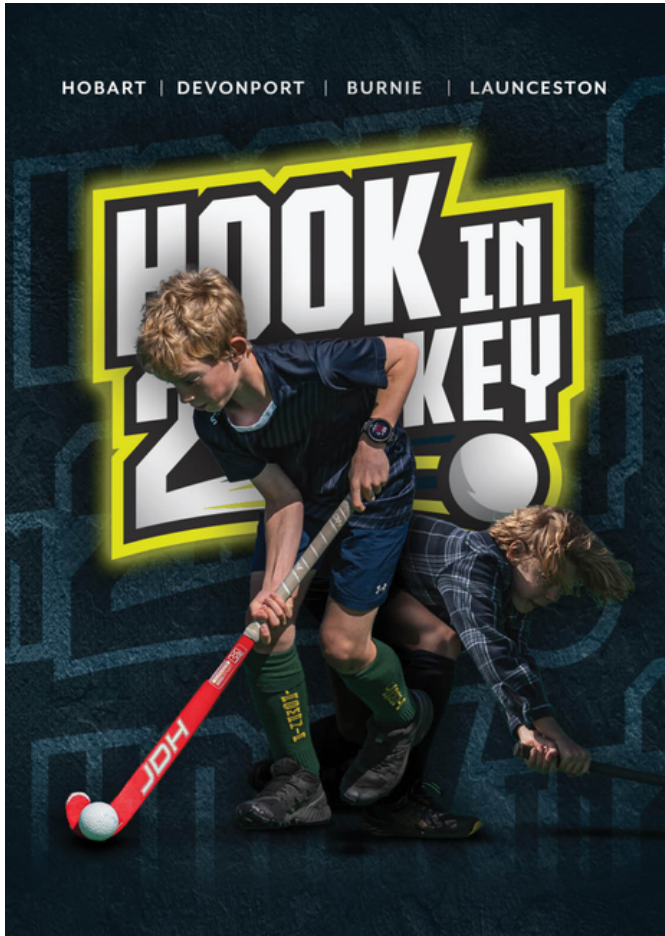
