Reading Priority Updates

A major focus of our School Improvement Plan at ACPS for 2024 is improving student reading achievement.

TARGET – The percentage of P-6 students achieving reading standard will be at least 92%.

TARGET – The percentage of Year 1-6 students achieving medium – high annual growth in reading will increase to at least 84%.

National and international research shows that the process of learning to read can be broken down into lots of individual skills. From Prep to Year 2, this approach to teaching reading starts with phonics. In middle and upper primary, there is a greater focus on vocabulary, fluency and comprehension.

The Big Six

1. **Oral language** – Talking and listening provides a foundation for learning to read
2. **Phonological awareness** – Being able to recognise the individual sounds in speech
3. **Phonics** – Being able to recognise the relationship between letters and sounds
4. **Vocabulary** – Knowing the meaning of a word makes you more likely to be able to read it.
5. **Fluency**– This is not just about being able to read quickly, it's about reading in a way that shows you understand the meaning.
6. **Comprehension** – understanding what you read.

Reading at Home

Reading at home with your child sets them up for life. Supporting your child to read at home is one of the most powerful things you can do for them.

All reading is good reading! This includes reading recipes, instructions and websites – it doesn't have to be a book. Encourage and celebrate all the reading your child does.

You can encourage your child to:

- Read books together they bring home from school. Re-reading the same text multiple times assists with fluency and confidence building too!
- Borrow books from your school or local library, Sora App or home collection and read them.

More details on the Sora collection and borrowing can be found on the Libraries Tasmania webpage - All students with a Department for Education, Children and Young People (DECYP) email address and password can set up a Sora account either at school or at home.

- Read books, newspapers, magazines you have at home, including those you might access online. Tap into their interests – Is it gaming? Roblox? Music? Cars?
- Offer to read books to your child even when they can read by themselves – this is still boosting their vocabulary and comprehension.

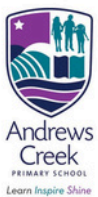

I live with two teenage daughters, two poodles named Oscar and Carbo and three canaries. I love to travel and go to live music events.

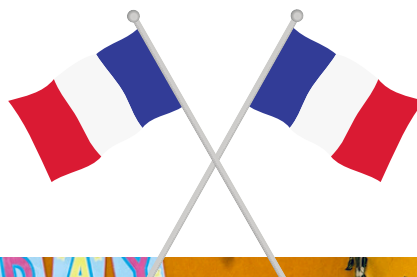
I am really looking forward to meeting all our families and supporting students in this rich and beautiful environment that you have here at Andrews Creek.

Resilience Project

This week's presentation from The Resilience Project focuses on Gratitude. Gratitude is paying attention to the things that we have right now, and not worrying about what we don't have. We practise this by noticing the positives that exist around us.

Research shows that practicing gratitude rewires our brains to overcome the negativity bias (which can lead to anxiety and depression) and see the world for what we are thankful for. It is also shown to broaden thinking, and increase physical health through improved sleep and attitude to exercise.

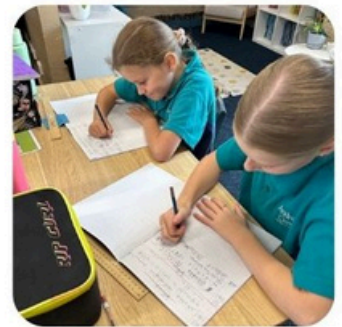

Help regulate time online

You may be concerned that your child is spending too much time playing online games. There is no magic number for 'healthy' hours or minutes. If gaming is balanced with other activities and sleep, there is usually no need for concern. Many young people game a lot and still study, socialise and feel happy.

But if gaming starts to have negative impacts on your child or your family, you may need to encourage them to better regulate their time online. You can read more about the [signs to look out for](#) when your child is spending too much time gaming. It may be useful to get your child to reflect on the [impact gaming is having on their life](#) by helping them do a self-evaluation.

If you have serious concerns about your child and online gaming or gambling, seek professional advice from a doctor, psychologist or school counsellor. Gaming disorder has now been recognised by the [World Health Organization](#)

as a mental health condition and there are practitioners who specialise in internet overuse problems. eSafety does not recommend any particular practice but there are listings on [niira](#).

Apraxia of Speech

Have you heard of Childhood Apraxia of Speech? May is Apraxia Awareness Month. May 14 is the internationally recognised, Apraxia Awareness Day. Several children on the NW Coast are living with Childhood Apraxia of Speech.

Childhood Apraxia of Speech is a lifelong motor speech disorder that affects 1-2 in 1000 children. Children with apraxia know what they want to say, but when they go to speak, they have difficulty moving their tongue, lips and jaw as well as turning their voice on and off to speak. This makes them hard to understand and is frustrating. Children with apraxia need to attend speech therapy up to 4 times a week.

This year, for the first time in Tasmania, there are several landmarks that will light up BLUE on May 14th which you can visit:

School Health Nurse News

Winter is nearly here!

These colder months are a time we're more likely to catch viral infections (colds, influenza or COVID19). This is such an important time to take extra care of ourselves and our families.

Keeping our immune systems strong can help prevent catching colds and the flu. So, what can we do to help our immune system?

Here are some suggestions:

Healthy Diet: Eating a varied, nutritious diet is a great way to help our bodies stay well. Remember to include 5 serves of vegetables and 2 serves of fruit.

Exercise: this can be admittedly harder during the winter months but is important to maintain our activity as best as we can!

Sleep: make sure you're getting enough sleep, as lack of sleep can affect our immune systems. Sticking to a regular sleep routine—even on weekends—maintains the timing of the body's internal clock and can help you fall asleep and wake up more easily. This is especially true for your children.

Keep warm: Wear layers of clothing. (We all know how easy it is to get caught out in Tasmania!) This is especially important for people with heart or respiratory problems such as asthma. Always have your children's puffer with you. The cold air can trigger an asthma attack.

Hand washing: Hand washing is one of the BEST and EASIEST ways to avoid becoming sick.

- ★ It affects 1-2 children in 1000.
- ★ Children with Childhood Apraxia of Speech know what they want to say but they have trouble moving their jaw, lips, and tongue to speak. This makes them hard to understand as their sounds and words don't come out correctly.
- ★ Early and intensive speech therapy is needed to improve their communication.
