Principal's Message

With 5 weeks remaining of the year things are really starting to heat up (both literally and figuratively!) There are many exciting things planned on the calendar over this time as well as plenty of learning that still needs to occur. Please be aware that as a part of our risk management process for excursions some are rated differently to others and will require different permissions and information from families. Your support in completing and returning these forms is appreciated by teachers planning events for our students.

Over the past 2 weeks as well as our Swimming and Water Safety program, students have also been participating in our main student achievement data collection process, known as Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT). These tests are done yearly and twice yearly for Prep to give us a collection of data to guide our planning from the whole school level through to the individual student level. These tests are a requirement for Tasmanian Schools during this time and provide valuable data.

At our first School Association meeting for Term 4, one of the items that was discussed was to review and update our Uniform and Dress Policy. All public schools in Tasmania are required to have an up-to-date Dress Code as a part of the Education Act. It is always good to review and update policies regularly and this one hadn't been done for quite some time. Part of this process involved members of the Student Representative Council looking over the policy as well as staff and the School Association. In the end only some minor changes were made, and most elements have remained the same. A link to the full document is on the next page but some of the main points to remember are:

Uniform items

The Everyday Uniform consists of the following items available from the school store:

- Full-length navy pants or shorts, (no active/sportswear)
- School teal polo shirt – long or short sleeve version,
- School dress, skirt or winter skirt,
- School rugby jumper or softshell jacket.

The footwear to accompany the Everyday Uniform must be enclosed shoes (all black) and socks (navy or black).

Dress code

The following requirements apply in relation to:

- Jewellery - only sleepers or studs, no necklaces, no rings, no bracelets (other than for medical purposes).
- Make-up – none. (This includes no nail polish).
- Footwear – enclosed/closed shoes (black only with no coloured soles or logos).
- Personal presentation/appearance – visible undergarments need to be navy.
- Hair accessories – in school colours.
- Raincoats/jacket – worn outside only navy in colour.
- Scarves and gloves/mittens – plain navy with no large emblems.
- Beanie - School beanie available (no other beanie may be worn).

I, along with all our staff and students are looking forward to next Friday's Athletics Carnival in conjunction with Sassafras Primary School. This will be a great day, and we look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible to be involved and build a great community atmosphere. I know we are still on the lookout for volunteers, to man the BBQ, so if you have a bit of time during the day please let the school know.

On the topic of great community events, don't forget to support our School Association's Car Boot Sale being held here at the school on Saturday 23rd November. See one of the many posters around for more details or speak to one of our School Association members.

Athletics Carnival Information

We are very excited that parents/carers and family members are able to join us at our 2024 Athletics Carnival. Sassafras Primary will be joining us again which is fantastic. To make our event safe and enjoyable for everyone we ask that you please read the following requirements for entry. We have also attached a map to help those who aren't familiar with our school.



Back Up Day – In the instance of bad weather, we will reschedule our carnival to the following **Tuesday 19 November**. We will let the school community know via facebook and text notification that morning.



Toilets – Visitors are asked to use the toilets in the Interactive Garden area (south side of the hall) only. These will be cleaned regularly throughout the day by cleaning staff. Students will be using separate toilets near the playground.



Parking – We ask parents to please park at the Wesley Vale Fire Station, or Westwind Drive as there will be no parking on the oval.



Designated Seating Area. – We will have a designated seating area for parents/carers on the south side of the track. There will be plenty of space to spread out your chairs. We ask parents not to stand at the finish line. We know you will want to take photos but please do this from the side lines. We ask that parents don't come over to the student side of the track.



Uniforms – Students are not required to wear school uniform on Carnival Day. They will need to wear their house t-shirts (teal or purple), these are for sale at the office for \$10, with navy shorts and sneakers.



Program – There is a program attached with all of the times and events.

Lunch/Recess – Students will need to bring a packed recess and water bottle. We will be eating recess and lunch on the oval to assist with supervision and keeping the day running on time.

The School Association are providing one free sausage to each student for lunch. Please pack your child extra food if needed.



Food and Drinks - A coffee van will be available on the day, and we ask that parents don't purchase drinks for students. They are to drink water only please. If you go to the Wesley Vale shop, please do not take your child with you.

Sausages will be available for our parents and family members to purchase at the School Association Committee BBQ for \$2 each. Please bring cash.

Icy poles will be provided by Sassafras Primary School at the conclusion of the carnival.



SunSmart – Students will be taking their school hat from their classroom, so they do not need to bring a hat. Sunscreen is available in classrooms and will be reapplied during the day. We ask that parents/carers ensure that their child has sunscreen on prior to arriving at school (especially younger students).



Buses – Students who normally catch buses will be able to do so as the carnival is due to conclude by 2.30pm. If you are at the carnival and take your child home, **you must let the class teacher know** particularly if they are marked down for the bus.

Student Participation – We expect all students to participate in every race apart from the 400m (which is optional). We also encourage every child to come to school on Friday and do their best.



Adult Events - We will have adult events again this year and hope that you are able to participate in this fun day!

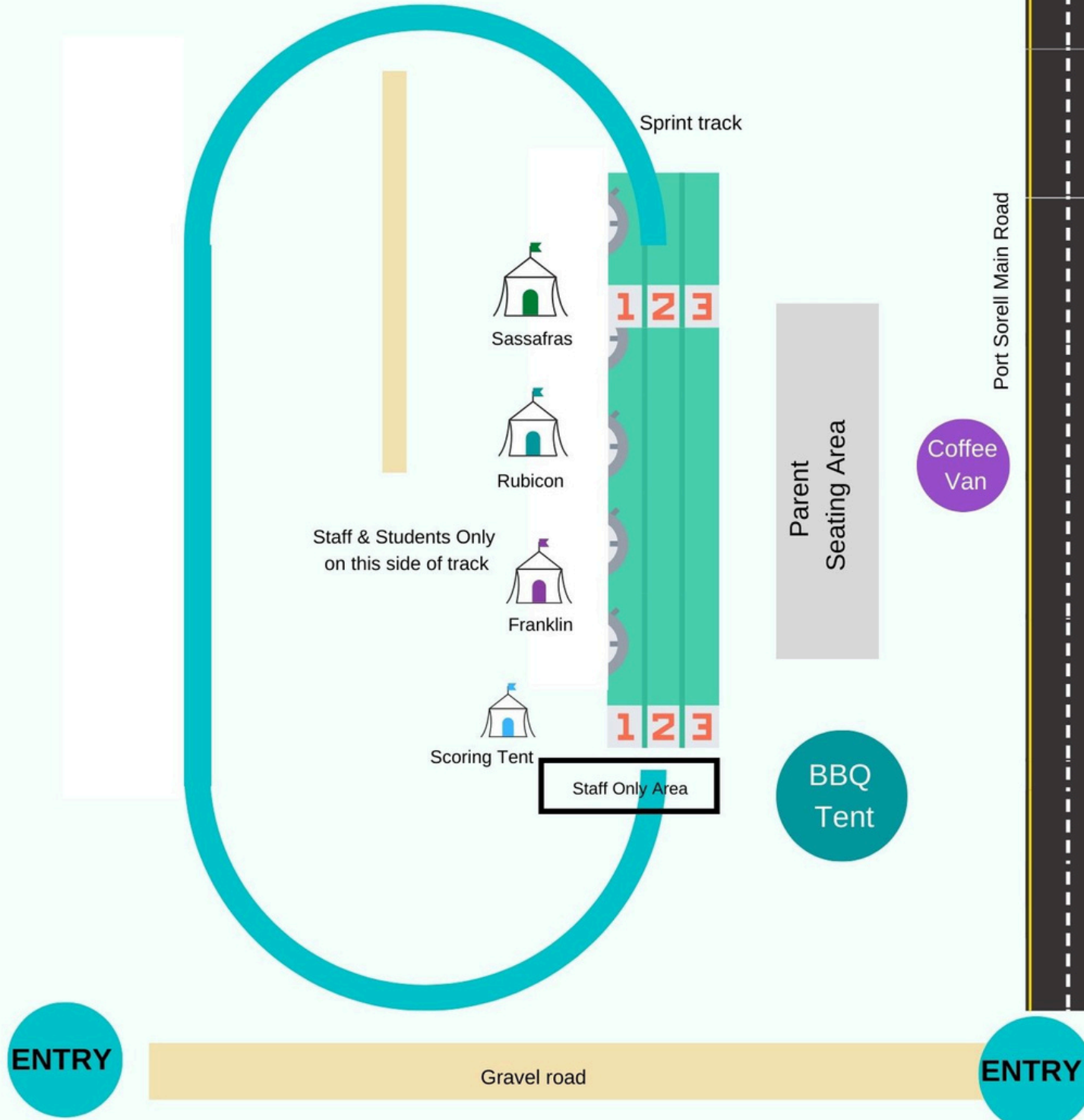

In High School, I am looking forward to all the wonderful new opportunities and things that I can do and experience such as MDT and cooking.



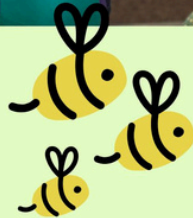


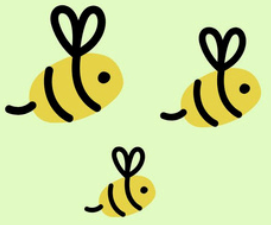

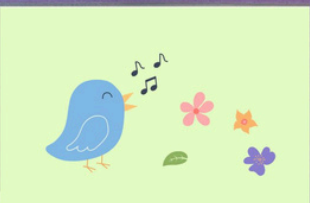

AUSTRALIAN GOLF FOUNDATION

AGF Junior Girls Scholarship Program

This program is designed to foster a deep love for golf by creating a strong bond between girls (aged 9-16) and their golf club/facility, aligning to Golf Australia's strategic plan for women and girls. By encouraging and supporting junior program participants to continue their golfing journey beyond the introductory phase and to obtain a handicap, this program seeks to reduce dropout rates of teenage girls in golf.

While the primary aim is to retain girls already engaged in golf, the program is also open to newcomers who demonstrate a strong commitment to learning the sport. However, based on previous experience, it is preferred that participants have some previous experience within golf.

Program Outline

- 24 sessions with a PGA Professional or National Program Deliverer
- Provide a free one-year junior club membership (supplied by club)
- Girls will receive a yellow shirt and AGF Cap (supplied by Golf Australia)
- Clubs host an introductory and graduation ceremony to celebrate the girls in the program
- Funding supplied to the clubs by the Australian Golf Foundation to support the program

- 22 or more girls \$6,300
